- Mitchell House Engage in history touring a home where Frederick Douglass' sister Eliza Bailey Mitchell once lived.
- **Changing Exhibitions** Enjoy one of our special exhibitions in this two-level gallery.
- Van Lennep Auditorium (VLA) See highlights from CBMM's nameboard and trailboard collection in our community exhibition gallery and program and event space.

- **Oystering on the Chesapeake** Climb aboard a real skipjack and step into the world of a Chesapeake Bay waterman.
- Waterman's Wharf Pull up an eel pot, catch some blue crabs, or tong for ovsters.

NAVY POINT

- Fishing Shanty Floating shanty cabins were used by Bay watermen while fishing away from home.
- **Small Boat Shed** Discover the re-created interior of a crab picking plant, and a collection of boats once used in fisheries.
- At Play on the Bay (APOB) Explore how the Bay has changed over the last 100 years from a place of work to a place of play.
- **Thor** Climb aboard and play in the pilot house of the 1912 buyboat.
- Floating Fleet The largest collection of Chesapeake Bay watercraft in the world. (Boats are moved around the harbor in winter.)
- Hooper Strait Lighthouse Experience the life of a lighthouse keeper and climb to the top for the best view on CBMM's campus.
- Point Lookout Bell Tower Point Lookout Lighthouse and its accompanying bell tower once guided vessels into the Potomac River.
- Tolchester Beach Bandstand Formerly located at one of the Bay's most popular summer resorts, Tolchester Beach.
- **Bay History** Examine the role the Chesapeake Bay has played in the
