Welcome to CBMM

- 1 CBMM Welcome Center** Start your visit with an orientation experience and explore stories of the Bay's people and places in the *Water Lines* exhibition.
- 2 Heirloom Garden & Log House** Explore a garden featuring plants and herbs grown in the region across four centuries, adjacent to a typical tenant farmer house of the 1800s.
- 3 Mitchell House** Engage in history touring a home where Frederick Douglass' sister Eliza Bailey Mitchell once lived.
- 4 Oystering on the Chesapeake** Get on board a real skipjack and step into the world of a Chesapeake Bay waterman.
- 5 Katie G.** Take the wheel of a miniature deadrise workboat.
- 6 Living Shoreline** Enjoy a view of the Miles River as you learn about Chesapeake Bay ecology.
- 7 Bay History** Examine the role the Chesapeake Bay has played in the nation's history.
- 8 South Entrance** This campus gateway is home to Patriot Cruises Ticketing, the Shipyard Store, and the Marina Guest Center. (Open seasonally)
- 9 Shipyard Projects** See and interact with CBMM's shipwrights as they restore and build Chesapeake Bay boats in our working Shipyard.
- 10 Hooper Strait Lighthouse** Experience the life of a lighthouse keeper and climb to the top for a bird's-eye view of CBMM's campus and the Miles River..
- 11 Point Lookout Bell Tower** Point Lookout Lighthouse and its accompanying bell tower once guided vessels into the Potomac River.
- 12 Tolchester Beach Bandstand** A surviving structure from one of the Bay's most popular summer resorts in Kent County Md.
- 13 Floating Fleet** The largest collection of Chesapeake Bay watercraft in the world. Boats are moved next to Patriot Cruises in winter.
- 14 Thor** Climb aboard and play in the pilot house of the 1912 buyboat.
- 15 At Play on the Bay (APOB)** Explore how the Bay has changed over the last 100 years from a place of work to a place of play.



- 16 Small Boat Shed** Discover the re-created interior of a crab picking plant, and a collection of vessels once used in fisheries.
- 17 Fishing Shanty** Floating shanty cabins were used by Bay watermen while fishing away from home.
- 18 Corn Crib** Get an up-close view of CBMM's shipwrights at work on special projects.
- 19 Waterman's Wharf** Pull up an eel pot, catch some blue crabs, and tong for oysters.
- 20 Van Lennep Auditorium (VLA)** See highlights from CBMM's trailboard collection and a community exhibition in this program and event space.
- 21 Changing Exhibitions** Enjoy a special exhibition in this two-level gallery.
- 22 Museum Store** Bring home the perfect reminder of your CBMM experience.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION



Campus walkways are largely boardwalk or gravel. Most buildings are accessible by ramps and elevators, with the exception of the Hooper Strait Lighthouse, Shipyard observation balcony, and lower level of *Oystering on the Chesapeake*. The Shipyard includes uneven terrain. Please watch your step as you explore the grounds.
